Understand the divine callings of men and women.

President Spencer W. Kimball, speaking of the creation of Adam and Eve, said:

"As they completed this magnificent creation, they looked it over and pronounced it 'good, very good'—something that isn't to be improved upon by our modern intellectuals; the male to till the ground, support the family, to give proper leadership; the woman to cooperate, to bear children, and to rear and teach them. It was 'good, very good.'

"And that's the way the Lord organized it. This wasn't an experiment. He knew what he was doing" ("The Blessings and Responsibilities of Womanhood," Ensign, March 1976, p. 71).

Why is there confusion in the world today about the proper callings of men and women? Do you understand what the gospel teaches about these callings? Can you find security and peace in fulfilling your calling?

1 The Man Is to Preside, Provide, and Protect

President Spencer W. Kimball commented: "I have a question about the word *rule*. It gives the wrong impression. I would prefer to use the word *preside* because that's what he does. A righteous husband presides over his wife and family" ("The Blessings and Responsibilities of Womanhood," p. 72). How should a husband preside over his wife and children?

McKay said, "Woman's mission and throne is the family, and if anything is withheld that would make her more efficient, useful, or happy in that sphere, she is wronged and has not her rights" (Church News, 24 Jan. 1970, p. 2). How can a man lighten his wife's load? With what should he provide her?
■ Ephesians 5:25. How can you love your wife as required in this verse?
President Kimball said:
"Can you think of how [Christ] loved the Church? Its every breath was important to him. Its every growth, its every individual, was precious to him. He gave to those people all his energy, all his power, all his interest. He gave his life—and what more could one give?
"When the husband is ready to treat his household in that manner, not only his wife but also his children will respond to his loving and exemplary leadership. It will be automatic. He won't need to demand it" (<i>Men of Example</i> , address to religious educators [published by the Church Educational System], 12 Sept. 1975, p. 5).

President Kimball said: "Women are expected to earn the living only in emergencies, and . . . many are the broken homes resulting when women leave their posts at home. You see, if 'both husband and wife are working away from home and come home tired, it is very easy for unpleasantness and misunderstandings to arise" (Faith Precedes the Miracle, p. 129).

■ President Marion G. Romney said:		
"[Husbands and wives] should be one in harmony, respect, and mutual consideration. Neither should plan or follow an independent course of action. They should consult, pray, and decide together.		
"In the management of their homes and families, husbands and wives should counsel with each other in kindness, love, patience, and understanding" ("In the Image of God," <i>Ensign</i> , March 1978, p. 2; compare Moses 5:12, first sentence of 16).		
■ What are the husband and wife expected to do?

■ President Kimball said:

- "There must be a great unselfishness, forgetting self and . . . subjugating self.
- "... There must be continued courting and expressions of affection, kindness, and consideration to keep love alive and growing.
- "... There must be a complete living of the commandments of the Lord as defined in the gospel of Jesus Christ" (1976 Devotional Speeches of the Year [Provo, Utah: Brigham Young University Press, 1977], p. 147).

If all husbands and wives heeded this counsel, would marital unhappiness, misunderstandings, or divorces occur? How well are you applying this counsel in your own marriage? When was the last time you expressed your affection and appreciation to your wife? Has she done anything to make your life fulfilled? Have you told her so?

Will It Make a Difference?

President Kimball issued this challenge: "And so we plead with you fathers to return to your little kingdoms and, with kindness, justice, proper discipline, and love, to inspire your family. We appeal to mothers to help create that happy family relationship. We desire that our people strengthen their families" (Men of Example, p. 5).

Quorum Training Suggestions

This lesson may generate much discussion. Many members of the quorum may have strong feelings about the ideas discussed. It will be important for you to make sure that the quorum members understand the basic callings of men and women as given in the scriptures and as taught by modern prophets.

- To encourage individual study of the self-instruction materials, use questions such as these to begin the quorum discussion: How should a man treat his wife and his children? In what ways can a husband encourage his wife to magnify her calling as a wife and a mother? What must a husband and wife do to become one?
- Encourage quorum members to sit down with their wives during a quiet hour to study the self-instruction materials together.
- List on the chalkboard the many aspects of the callings of a man and a woman. Under the title *Man*, for example, you might list *husband*, *father*, *provider*, and *protector*. Under *Woman*, you might list *wife*, *mother*, and *homemaker*.
- Discuss the ways a righteous husband should preside over his family. Use D&C 38:27 and 121:41–44 in the discussion. Refer also to President Marion G. Romney, "In the Image of God" (Ensign, March 1978, pp. 2–4); and Elder Bruce R. McConkie, "Our Sisters from the Beginning" (Ensign, Jan 1979, pp. 61–63).
- Caution the quorum members to avoid judging their wives or their children and to develop an attitude of helpfulness and love. Use Matthew 7:1–5 and the following statements of President Harold B. Lee and Elder Marvin J. Ashton in your discussion. President Lee observed: "Someone has said that a
